Traditionally our law approached voidability on I
assumption = there are 2 grounds for rescission
existed is misrep & duress & then undue influence
was recognised.

(a) CONSENSUS OBTAINED BY IMPROPER MEANS

With regard to voidability in Leyes of Llaw consensus
has been obtained in an improper manner.

3) Improper conduct.

Van de merwe - a contractant would be entitled to plead any facts which support I conclusion I his consent was obtained improperly.

Improper conduct would amount to wrongful conduct in I delictual sense.

In Plaaslike Boeredienster V Chemfos - a contractant had bribed I agent of I other contractant to persuade I latter to conclude I contract. Court found II contract could be rescinded. I court held I act of persuasion through bribery did not constitute fraud as such but amounted to an improper means of obtaining consensus.
