Assignments:

The lay out of the assignment was thoroughly discussed and explained and students were referred to their Tutorial letter 101. Scientific presentation of assignments was fully explained, for example, the assignment must consist of a cover page, table of contents, introduction, definition, content (main body), conclusion and bibliography. Each of these sections must have a heading and must be underlined. The assignment should not be more than ten pages and the correct referencing must be followed, which is also explained in the tutorial letter.

Common mistakes made by students:

- **Many students cut and paste from the study guide, which is plagiarism(Refer to Tutorial Letter 301). You are penalised for that.**
- **Many students do not use other sources, for which you are penalised.**
- **Many students do not follow the correct lay out of the assignment and are penalised for that.**
- **Many students do not read thoroughly through the study guide and therefore make unnecessary mistakes.**
- **We have marked most of the assignments and you will get your results soon.**
