TEXT A

The early sixties had been a period of considerable violence. Although the ANC and PAC were banned they were active underground *Umkhonto we Sizwe* (The Spear of the Nation), the ANC's military wing had launched a campaign of sabotage, government offices were bombed, electric pylons blown up, telephone lines cut.

Mandela said that they had decided on sabotage rather than terrorism because they did not want to kill anyone. Their aim was to scare away foreign capital and draw world attention to South Africa. On 12 June 1964 the seven month trial ended, Mandela and seven others, including one white, were sentenced to life imprisonment. The verdict was followed by a fresh outbreak of sabotage.

The fear of avenging black masses, whether Communist or not, provided the justification for all measures to safeguard the security of the state Most white people, therefore, were not going to quibble that some of the provisions of the terrorism Act were more suited to a police state
