CONTEXTUAL FACTORS INFLUENCING PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT RESULTS

Biological context – age related, physical impairment

- Intra psychic context transient conditions, psychopathology
- Social context schooling, language, culture, environmental factors, test-wiseness
