The question in the examination relating to any of them will normally be posed as a hypothetical question/case study or an essay type question. With regard to the three system, ensure that you are able to focus on the points discussed below and in the table.

With reference to the three Regional Human Rights System- you must be able to discuss the following:

- a) Conventions providing for various rights under each system and state if there are additional protocols or not and what they aim to address or achieve.
- b) Enforcement mechanisms available-whether it is courts or commissions or both.
- c) The jurisdiction of the courts/commissions.
- d) Who can bring cases before the court/commission? Explain in detail.
- e) Which cases are admissible?
- f) What are the remedies available?
- g) Are the decision of the court/commission enforceable?
