Questions 2.1 to 2.3 are based on the case study below:

Vusi is a very intelligent young boy who is doing Grade 09 at Solomon Mahlangu Secondary School at Mshengu in Soshanguve. His mother, a teacher at a local school, is always busy with her school work and does not have spend much time with her son. Vusi's father drives long distance trucks, and, as a result, comes home only once per quarter. Vusi's performance at school started to drop after he started using a highly addictive and destructive street drug called nyaope, and his class teacher became aware of that. Vusi was then reported to the school principal Both Vusi and his parents were subsequently summoned to the school principal's office and were referred to the local social worker.

The following is what transpired during the interview with the social worker. Vusi had the following to say "I started using nyaope because when I am high I don't have to think about my parents who always don't have time for me" "In fact, I no longer want to use nyaope, I would like to be referred to a drug rehabilitation centre and when I am discharged I want my parents to love and support me as their child," he concluded with tears rolling down his face
